

International Conservation Services Australian Bursary Application Form

Building Conservation Masterclass Bursaries

Bursaries are available to Australian Nationals living in the UK who have a visa that allows them to study in the UK and who have accepted a place on a Building Conservation Masterclass (BCM) on the Professional Development Diploma (PDD) in Historic Building Conservation and Repair at West Dean.

How to complete this form

- Read the criteria below to make sure you are eligible to apply
- Complete the form fully, making sure that you have covered the criteria in your personal statement

The Grants Committee consider applications. Applicants should note that students will be required to sign terms and conditions if awarded a grant.

Deadline and application submission

- Open all year until funds expended – £2,000 is the value of the total bursary pot
- Applicants that meet the criteria can apply for a contribution towards course costs, max allocation of £500 for each masterclass

Bursary and awarding criteria

The International Conservation Services (ICS) Australian Bursary is available to Australian Nationals living in the UK who have a visa that allows them to study in the UK and who have accepted a place on a Building Conservation Masterclass (BCM) on the Professional Development Diploma (PDD) in Historic Building Conservation and Repair at West Dean. The BCM is not a validated programme with the University of Sussex and as such we cannot issue student visas, so you need to hold another way of being in the country that allows you to study here. Behind the funding: For over 30 years, Julian Bickersteth, 1981-1982 Graduate Diploma Conservation Studies Furniture and Related Objects alumnus, has been the CEO of International Conservation Services (ICS), which he founded in 1986. ICS is Australia's largest private fine art and heritage conservation practice, with labs in Sydney, Melbourne, Canberra, Brisbane and Perth employing over 50 permanent staff plus casuals. ICS works across the disciplines of furniture, paintings, works on paper, textiles, metals, sculpture, archaeology and outdoor heritage for myriad collecting institutions including government bodies, corporations, major universities and private collections.

Having received a part scholarship to help him study at West Dean, Julian is keen to give others a similar opportunity. That opportunity ultimately led to Julian being President of IIC for

6 years until January 2025, and in recognition of this Julian has established the International Conservation Services Australian Bursary.

Value: Contribution towards course costs, max allocation of £500 for each masterclass.

Deadline: Open all year

Application: To be eligible to apply, applicants must be Australian nationals, already be living in the UK, have a visa that allows them to study here, have a place accepted to study one of our Building Conservation Masterclasses (BCM), demonstrate a commitment to a career in conservation (they could already be practicing in the UK or be looking to further their studies in this area before advancing their conservation career), must demonstrate a clear aim for career development in conjunction with finding it difficult to find funds for professional development fees. Applicants of any age are eligible to apply.

Preference will be given to applicants intending to take their skills back to Australia after study. The Grants Committee will consider the applications and details of the successful applicants such as name, personal statement, work history will be sent to Julian Bickersteth and ICS for their records.

Terms: Recipients must use the funding in the calendar year received. The award will be paid directly to West Dean College to help offset course fees.

Please note: The applicant recognises that some additional funding from personal sources is likely to be required, and that transport, visa and living costs are their own responsibility. The successful applicant must produce a report on completion of each BCM which will be shared with the funder and may be used for publication or summary on the ICS website and/or social media channels at the discretion of the ICS. The successful applicant on completion of their course may be invited to an ICS event.
